Antioch CELEBRATION Message: Who Are My Neighbors?

Sermon Series: Neighbors Dates: February 18-19, 2017

Suggested Conversation Starter

When you were a kid, how would you have responded to this question: "What is the most important commandment according to the church?"

LEARN / live / love / lead

One of them, an expert in religious law, tried to trap him with this question: "Teacher, which is the most important commandment in the law of Moses?" Jesus replied, "'You must love the LORD your God with all your heart, all your soul, and all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. A second is equally important: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' The entire law and all the demands of the prophets are based on these two commandments." Matthew 22:35–40, NLT

If a five-year-old were to ask you, "How do I love God?" what would your response be?

What misunderstandings come up when we think about "loving" our neighbor?

Pastor John said, "To love your neighbor is to intend their good." How would you describe that concept in your own words?

What does it say about God's heart in sharing the importance of loving Him with loving your neighbor?

Why is self-love (you could also call it self-honor or self-care) a prerequisite to loving your neighbor?
